More Able and Talented Opportunities:

Year 10 Residential Trip - Oxford University:

In March, Year 10 pupils of black heritage were given the opportunity to apply for a residential course at Oxford University called 'EMPower Oxford'. It was for pupils considering studying Engineering, Materials or Physics at University. Daniella Nakazzi was one of hundreds of pupils from across the UK who applied, and she was successful in gaining one of the 30 places. She and her Mum travelled by train to Oxford where she was treated like a university student for three days, even living in the university accommodation. She said about her experience:

"It was an incredible opportunity as I got a chance to discuss with some of the current Oxford students about what life is like as an Oxford student and how much effort you must put to get into the university. I also did Engineering, Material Science and Physics workshops that gave me a bit more detail about what these subjects are and whether they might be right for me to do in the future. During the workshop, I visited some of the University's amazing laboratories where I did some practicals and got introduced to some amazing ideas from the world's leading research. I also went for a tour to ISIS Neutron and Muon source, one of the world's leading science research laboratories and here I learnt about neutrons and muons and how they help to detect dangerous nuclear materials. Those are just some of the activities we did and there are still more."

Daniella encourages other pupils to apply for the opportunities sent out by the school, as you just don't know where they may lead.

By working together we can ensure your child's success.





Dear Parent /Guardian,

The vaccine helps to protect a person from being infected by the Human Papillomavirus. This virus increases the risk of developing some cancers later in life such as cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers and some cancers of the anus and genital area, it also helps protect against genital warts. The HPV vaccine does not protect against other sexually transmitted infections.

If you would like your child to receive the HPV vaccine please provide consent by completing the E-consent form.

To access the E-consent form please use the link below, or scan the QR code (by holding your mobile phone over the QR code with your camera app open). Links to further information regarding HPV and the vaccine are available on the E-consent form. If you wish to complete the E-consent form in Welsh, there is an option to access this once you have opened the E-consent by clicking on the top right-hand corner tab.

It is essential that you provide a valid email address when completing the E-consent form to receive correspondence and a confirmation receipt from the immunisation team.

Please provide your child's NHS number on the consent form, this can be found in their personal child health record book (Red Book) any NHS appointment letters or by contacting their GP practice.

If you have any difficulties accessing or completing the electronic consent form or need any further advice please contact the immunisation team.
