# Ethnic Minority Recruitment in Schools:

A member of our teaching staff, Mr Konten, who is Head of Design and Technology has been working with Cardiff Met University on research into Ethnic Minority Recruitment to Initial Teacher Education (ITE). He was an influential figure in securing a research contract from the Welsh Government to evaluate 'Ethnic Minority Recruitment to Initial Teacher Education and the Teaching Profession in Wales'.

The important project, which will run until the end of March 2021, will also establish perceptions of serving ethnic minority teachers about their ongoing career progression and will engage learners aged 14+ to gain an understanding of their views of teaching as a possible career thus informing changes required to increase the recruitment of Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic students to the teaching profession.

To further add to this, we are pleased to announce that Mr. Konten has also taken on the role of Community Governor at one of our feeder schools, Mount Stuart Primary School. As a past pupil, he is extremely honoured and proud of the opportunity to have an input on the future of children's lives, where he lives and resides. Da iawn, Mr. Konten – we are proud of your work in this important area.

#### Health and Well-being:

Next week pupils will be receiving an assembly on the importance of being safe online and some guidance on how to protect themselves from phishing scams and other forms of cyber harassment. Whilst we understand, that it is difficult to monitor children's activity online, please ensure that you have spoken to your child about the potential dangers and consequences of engaging with unsafe websites and strangers on social media.

# Community:



Lastly, we know our friends at Railway Gardens have some exciting developments coming up over the next few months – we will keep you posted!





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
# **Competition Time:**

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
