Return to School:

We are delighted that we will be welcoming Y11 back to school from Monday 15th March for the last two weeks of term.

Year 10 will return to school on Monday 22nd March for the last week of term.

Year 7 will attend school on Tuesday 23rd March for a Check in-day.

Year 8 will attend school on Wednesday 24th March for a Check in-day.

Year 9 will attend school on Thursday 25th March for a Check-in day.

For the week commencing 15th March, we will continue with the current home learning timings of the day.

From the 22nd March we will need to return to timings that include split lunches and breaks throughout the day so that the instances where Year Groups in school come into contact with each other are minimised. We will ensure that teachers communicate this with pupils and set their online lessons accordingly for pupils to access at the correct times.
