





Modern Foreign Languages:



The French department were invited by Cardiff University to take part in a trial of resources which have been developed in collaboration with

the London School of Economics and The British Academy. We were delighted to receive this invitation and to support the early stages of what will be an exciting project. We trialled the materials with Year 8 classes and were delighted with their enthusiastic and mature response to the topics covered. We looked at the impact that trains have had on the development of our communities and how they have driven social change and mobility. Pupils were also encouraged to look at the impact, both positive and negative, of HS2. We have provided feedback on the resources to the Universities and are looking forward to further involvement in SHAPE as it is introduced more widely in schools. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) Opportunity:

Mrs. Warren has e-mailed all pupils in Years 9 and 10 to inform them about 'Virtual Routes into STEM,' an innovative course that provides Year 9 and Year 10 students with a clear understanding of the amazing opportunities offered by STEM based careers. The course allows students to recognise the variety of opportunities available to them after taking their GCSEs, it will provide access to key information on different pathways: College and University and Apprenticeship routes through industry. The course is suitable for all academic abilities – all that is required is a genuine interest in STEM subjects.

Return to School:

We are currently expecting all pupils to return to school on Monday 12th April. When pupils return they will be **expected to wear school uniform**. This recommendation is contained in the Welsh Government operational guidance. Please contact your child's Welfare Officer if you foresee any problems with this. **On days where pupils have PE, they will continue to wear their PE kit to school** (as before Christmas) until further notice. Pupils will need to wear face coverings (black – provided by school) in the classroom where physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Staff and pupils in Y10 and Y11 have been provided with Lateral Flow Tests which detect Covid-19. The tests should be performed on a Sunday and Wednesday evening by following the instructions provided. It is vitally important for parents to inform school of any positive results and to keep their household at home for ten days to protect our

community. If you require assistance with the instructions, please contact your child's Welfare Officer who will be happy to help.


