INGREDIENTS FOR THE BURGER:

750g of minced beef,
One large onion,
Half a teaspoon of paprika
Half a teaspoon of black pepper
Two cloves of garlic
Tea spoon of garlic powder
One tablespoon of sugar
Half cup of self-raising flour, or two
slices of white bread
Two eggs
Salt and pepper to your individual
tastes.

INGREDIENTS FOR THE RELISH:

Two sticks of celery
1 medium sized onion
3 or 4 hot chillies
1 red yellow or green sweet peppers
One red onion
5 overripe tomatoes or one tin of plum tomatoes
One tablespoon of sugar

Two tablespoon of sugar
Two tablespoons of apple cider vinegar
Two or three gherkins depending on
how big

Welcome to the second edition of the One Planet Cardiff Schools Newsletter!

This is the second edition of the new newsletter, which, we hope, will help to keep you updated with information that relates to the One Planet Cardiff (OPC) agenda. We want this resource to provide you with useful information; highlight best practice; sign post you to good resources; and include links to good opportunities for schools. The seven key themes of the OPC Strategy will form the basis of the newsletter i.e. Built Environment, Energy, Food, Green Infrastructure & Biodiversity, Transport, Waste and Water. RESULTS OF THE ONE PLANET CARDIFF CONSULTATION WITH YOUNG PEOPLE

You may recall from the previous edition of this newsletter, that the OPC consultation survey for young people was promoted. **Nearly 900 young people** responded to the survey which is a great return; thanks to everyone that took part or encouraged the pupils to respond to the survey! The results of the three surveys (there were separate surveys for the public and businesses/organisations too) will help to finalise the OPC Strategy. Here is a link to a cabinet report which details the key OPC progress; it also presents the main outcomes from the consultations.

The OPC themes, ranked in order of importance by the young people:

- 1. Energy
- 2. Built Environment
- 3. Green Infrastructure & Biodiversity
- 4. Food
- 5. Waste
- 6. Transport
- 7. Water



Headline responses to the young people survey:

- 'Education' was identified as a key missing part of the draft OPC strategy.
- 'Renewable energy' was the highest voted action to help make Cardiff carbon neutral.
- 'Active travel' was the most popular individual action to help with decarbonisation.
- If one thing could be chosen that the Council would do, 'green energy use and research' was most popular.

ACTIVE TRAVEL & TRANSPORT UPDATE

Cardiff Council has a vision by 2030 to change the way people travel around the city and make radical changes to respond to the climate emergency, for clean air and to create safe and healthy communities.

As the Active Travel Schools team, we work with schools across Cardiff to put together an Active Travel Plan to support families and staff in increasing active travel to school such as walking, cycling or scooting, and decrease car usage. Since April, five schools have been taking part in **WOW**, an initiative from Living Streets where children report how they get to school every day using an interactive travel tracker. If they travel actively to school for a month, they get rewarded with a badge, as well as the most active class in the school earning a trophy! These schools are Moorland Primary School, Ninian Park Primary School, St Marys RC Primary School, St Pauls CW Primary School and Whitchurch Primary School. All five schools have seen a huge difference in their active travel rates, even noticing a lack of congestion outside the school gates. We hope this will continue as the initiative continues throughout the year. This is fully funded by Cardiff Council. What is even more exciting, 40 more schools are starting in September. YES – 40!! WASTE & RECYCLING





GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE & BIODIVERSITY UPDATE

Cardiff Green Wall project – The Cardiff Local Nature Partnership has installed 'green walls' at Dusty Forge community centre and Kitchener Primary School. The walls are made from ivy and other climbing plants, creating a new habitat for wildlife and helping to reduce road noise and pollution. A citizen science programme is being run by the Wildlife Trust to monitor changes in biodiversity and air quality. This project was funded by the Welsh Government 'Local Places for Nature' programme. Funding is being sought to expand the scheme to other public buildings in high traffic areas. Wales Nature Week 29th May - 6th June – To celebrate Wales Nature Week, Local Nature Partnerships Cymru, are putting together a programme of virtual wildlife events and activities. Each day will focus on a different wildlife habitat with facts, figures, and video shorts from some of the best nature sites across Wales. The week starts on Saturday 29th May with the 'Big Garden Bioblitz', an opportunity to record the wildlife in your garden or local green space and have your sightings officially documented by your local wildlife record centre.
