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

Pearson Teaching Award:

We were delighted to present our very own, Mr. Joseph Gill with a prestigious award this week. Mr. Gill has been honoured as one of 102 Pearson National Teaching Silver Award winners from across the country. Mr. Gill's award was for 'Outstanding New Teacher of the Year' for his outstanding commitment to changing the lives of the children he works with every day.

Mr.Gill leads our EAL provision for pupils new to English. His excellent work has enabled vulnerable pupils to continue learning despite the pandemic. He has also created and led an integration programme so that children with little or no English, many of whom having experienced trauma in their own countries, can be supported before entering mainstream education.

He brings learning to life, bringing in tools, construction equipment and gardening utensils in a bid to keep pupils engaged. He also uses his break and lunch times to encourage pupils to play sport,

purposefully encouraging different ethnic backgrounds to interact and collaborate.

Joseph Gill has now been shortlisted to win one of just 15 Gold Awards later in the year, in a programme which will be broadcast on the BBC. We all have our fingers crossed and are extremely proud of him, our provision and all of our exceptional school staff who go above and beyond for

pupils every day.

Summer Holiday Cycling Courses:

Cardiff Council_are offering on-road National Standard Cycle Training courses (Level 2) during the Summer Holidays. There will be 6 courses with a total of 60 places available. Courses will run for 4 days and are being carried out on the following dates:

Monday 26th July-Thursday 29th July Monday 2nd August-Thursday 5th August Monday 9th August-Thursday 12th August

Pupils who wish to attend this course must be aged 9 and over, have access to a bike and helmet and be able to ride and control their bike. This course is free for any child who lives in Cardiff or attends a Cardiff school.

For High School pupils: if pupils achieve level 2 at the end of the course they can also attend a level 3 course. These courses can be arranged during the summer after they have attended the level 2 course.


