
Science:

As a part of our Genius Hour class project, we have chosen to support the charity Jacob Abraham Foundation. Jacob Abraham Foundation is an organisation that has been running since 2015. Each year they help approximately 240 people. Since 2015, in 6 years, they have helped up to 1,440 people who have been having suicidal thoughts or helping those suddenly bereaved by suicide.

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In the UK, a male dies every 2 hours by suicide. Worldwide a person dies every 40 seconds, and

75% death by suicide are males. In the UK, 4 school aged children die by suicide every single week, and 18 people die by suicide every day.

The Jacob Abraham Foundation do the following:

- Provide counselling
- Raise awareness for mental health
- Help you if you're experiencing suicidal thoughts
- Promote positive mental health
- Help you seek advice from your doctor or other professionals

Summer Holiday Cycling Courses:

Cardiff Council_are offering on-road National Standard Cycle Training courses (Level 2) during the Summer Holidays. There will be 6 courses with a total of 60 places available. Courses will run for 4 days and are being carried out on the following dates:

Monday 26th July-Thursday 29th July Monday 2nd August-Thursday 5th August Monday 9th August-Thursday 12th August

Pupils who wish to attend this course must be aged 9 and over, have access to a bike and helmet and be able to ride and control their bike. This course is free for any child who lives in Cardiff or attends a Cardiff school.


