### Covid-19:

Many thanks for keeping us informed of any positive LFT cases, and for booking your children for PCR tests if you are uncertain at the onset of Covid-like symptoms. Current positive cases at Willows remain in single figures within each year group. We strongly urge all members of the school community to <u>test twice a week</u> and to stay at home if you have symptoms or have a positive test.

Please be advised that if your son/daughter has to remain at home due to a positive test, if they are well and able to keep in touch with school work, then we have placed all of their work booklets onto their One Drive (accessed via their school Office365 / e-mail account). However, we are very aware that some pupils who are isolating are unwell or unable to keep in touch. In all cases, pupils should not be disheartened or overanxious as their teachers are aware of their situation and will give them guidance on their return


