



They were given coaching tips and a range of waterbased challenges. The group complete their final session with Tom in December and are due to attend an 'Empowerment Event' in January where they will have opportunity to talk to local businesses and explore future career paths.







This year some lucky pupils from Year 8 were able to attend the Hay Literature Festival in Hay-on-Wye on Thursday 25th November. They attended several talks by authors of popular children's books including, 'Karl Nova' the award-winning wordsmith, Hip Hop artist and poet who performed pieces from his new book. They attended interactive workshops throughout the day and had a chance to purchase discounted books and have their copies signed by the authors.

As well as this, all pupils from Years 7, 8 and 9 listened live to authors from The Hay Festival. The authors were live streamed to the school Theatre. Each year group watched a different author.

Year 7 - watched 'Sally Nichols' who talked about the process of writing a novel and discussed her research into the lives of women and mothers in the early twentieth century, based on her new novel The Silent Stars Go By.

Year 8 – watched 'Nichola Davies' an award-winning author, environmentalist and zoologist. She explored in her new novel 'The Song That Sings Us' whether dark forces are destroying nature and if those with the ability to listen to animal thoughts stand in their way. She asked the audience, 'who will learn 'The Song That Sings Us' and what it means, in the world of the story and on our own planet?

Year 9 – watched 'Karl Nova' an award-winning wordsmith, Hip Hop artist and poet who performed pieces from his new book. His freestyle performance was energetic as he told stories that were humorous, personal and inspirational.

Mock Interview Day:

Each pupil was required to complete an application form in preparation for their interview. The employers then discussed these forms with the pupils during the interviews which lasted about 20 minutes each. The pupils were asked a series of questions, as if they were attending a reallife college or job interview.

The feedback from the employers was superb. They were very impressed with the attitude, behaviour and depth of answers that the pupils gave. Overall, it was a very worthwhile exercise for the pupils who gained valuable experience.
