



#### **Science Competition for Y10 and Y11:**

Mrs. Warren has sent the following exciting competition via e-mail to Y10 and Y11. If you decide to enter, contact her and she will guide you with your entry:

The Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) have launched an economic competition for schools aimed at engaging students on international economic issues and students can win up to £250.

The FCDO is a department of the Government of the United Kingdom, it was created on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2020 through the merger of the Foreign & Commonwealth Office and the Department for International Development. They are responsible for the UK's relationship with the rest of the world, they manage the UK's diplomatic relationships, promote UK interest overseas, and oversees the UK's overseas development budget.

This competition aims to get students in years 10-13 (in England and Wales, or the equivalents in Scotland and Northern Ireland) thinking about the big economic challenges facing their generation.

In turn we hope to inspire a new generation of economists who are more diverse and open-minded than the current generation.

To enter the Next Generation Economics competition, students are required to write a letter no longer than 800 words to the FCDO Chief Economist responding to one of the following questions.

- 1. What economic policies should governments around the world use to economically empower women and girls?
- 2. What economic policies should the UK government use to facilitate a fair transition away from fossil fuels globally?

Students do not need to study economics! The winner will be announced in March 2022, they will receive £250 and be invited to present their ideas to the Chief Economist and their team at the FCDO. Runners up will also receive a cash prize. The winning letters will be published on the GOV.UK website and shared across the Government Economic Service. ## Rights Respecting Schools – Articles of the week:

<u>Article 7</u> – birth registration, name, nationality, care

Every child has the right to be registered at birth, to have a name and nationality, and, as far as possible, to know and be cared for by their parents.

<u>Article 8</u> – protection and preservation of Identity

Every child has the right to an identity. Governments must respect and protect that right, and prevent the child's name, nationality or family relationships from being changed unlawfully.



Even when people's identities are different, we can always find characteristics in common. Even when we have similar identities, we will have something that makes us individual. Our right to a name, a nationality and an identity is something special and should be valued.

Think about what makes you who you are. What are you proud of about yourself? Can you respect and appreciate other people's identity? How might you share this with them? How does respecting different identities make for a better world?

#### Feeling motivated? Have a go at these activities if you want to earn merits:

- Imagine if the government decided to ignore individual identity and just give everyone a number. Write a letter to protest about this explaining your opinions and feelings.
- Create a piece of art, a poem, a song, or dance to say something about your identity, such as the things you like, you as a person, what you enjoy and where you are from.... express yourself!

- 2D and 3D shapes with formulae




