Dubai Expo:

We have welcomed back Crystal, Marzooq and Miss. Nelms from their wonderful week in Dubai. Here Miss. Nelms tells us all about their amazing adventure ...

The Dubai Expo Factor competition was a competition to select four teams of two from across the four nations of the UK to represent the UK on UK National Day at the Dubai Expo. The trip itself was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for young people to shape the conversation on a truly global stage.



Crystal and Marzooq initially had to become Prime Minister and Chancellor for the day and create a video submission outlining their ideas to enter the competition. During the final interview they had to expand on their initial ideas as Prime Minister and Chancellor. They both discussed gender equality in education, deprivation in schools - with a focus on free school meals, the rise of cryptocurrency and Universal Base Income.

During the interview, they were also asked about a local issue within their school or local community and how they would come up with a solution. Crystal and Marzooq spoke about poverty and how this has increased significantly since the pandemic in their local area. They explained in great detail what this means for their community but also how this presents in a classroom drawing on their own experiences. They both spoke with great passion, and it was clear their main aim was to bring back the sense of community that Wales is renowned for.



For the final part of the interview, the pair had to sell themselves in under a minute explaining to the panel why they should be chosen to represent the UK. In these final moments you could really see their ambition and drive to make change and to showcase how great pupils at Willows truly are.

We were all in Dubai from 6th February to 11th February. Whilst out there, they experienced a range of experiences from desert trips to a trip to the top of the Burj Khalifa. The main focus of the trip was for them to be a part of a team of pupils from across the four nations of the UK to showcase their debating skills at UK National Day.

UK National Day took place at the Dubai Expo on Thursday 10th Feb. The day was filled with exciting events and even a visit Prince William. from Crystal and Marzoog were based at the UK Pavilion and were able showcase their debating the outside skills to audience on stage with audience participation. They also acted roaming reporters interviewing those attendance at the Expo.



Both Crystal and Marzooq were invited to perform a show debate during the VIP Commonwealth reception which included ambassadors of the commonwealth, businesspeople, sportspeople, and politicians including Nadine Dorries. The debate centred around "This house believes never has there been a better time for young people to make change" and questions from the audience were encouraged.

Added to this, Crystal was also chosen as one of the Baton Bearers for the Queens Baton Relay 2022 to walk between Commonwealth Pavilions meeting Olympians Tessa Sanderson and Ed Clancy.

I cannot express how proud I am as their English teacher to see them achieve something so great. It truly was a once-in-a-lifetime trip, and I couldn't have thought of any better young people to go to represent not only Willows High School but the UK.

STEM - Amazon Bootcamp:

30 of the Year 8 Students have volunteered to take part in a National project run by Amazon Web Service, Get I.T, that is looking at encouraging girls in to the Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths field. The project consists of the students developing an app to benefit their school or local community. The 5 groups took part in the Amazon Bootcamp, where they started to refine their final app ideas and learned about presentation skills, ready for their presentation to the Amazon Judges.



We were fortunate enough to have our Amazon Ambassador visit us from Bristol to discuss the refined ideas with the students and also discuss with them what made a winning app. The students and their ideas were absolutely incredible and it will be a close competition now to whittle the ideas down to 2 ready for final

submission. Fingers crossed some of the students will be able to represent Willows for the first time at an Amazon Web Service National semi-final. Good luck Year 8!

Healthy Eating:

Thank you to Julinho Mendonca (Y9) for recommending the following traditional Portuguese recipe:

Cataplana Portuguese fish stew

A cataplana takes its name from the Moorish designed copper domed dish it was originally cooked in. The dish was first introduced into the Algarve region of Southern Portugal way back in the 8th century .The food was placed in the bowl shaped base and the domed top provided a sealed space for the ingredients to simmer and infuse. Today the cast iron cocotte is a perfect replacement for such a cooking pot. Ingredients for the cataplana vary from region to region with use of much artistic licence but the base of tomatoes, onions, wine and herbs remains the same. This recipe influenced by the Western Algarve style includes potatoes, firm white seasonal fish, seafood, peppers and a hint of chilli added to the base sauce. Serve traditionally straight from the cooking pot with crusty bread.

Serves: 4

What you need:

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- o 100g (3 1/2 oz) pancetta cubetti or smoked bacon cut into small pieces
- o 100g (3 1/2 oz) chorizo sausage
- o 1 large mild Spanish onion chopped
- o 3 cloves garlic chopped
- 2 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes in juice
- o 250ml (1 cup) dry white wine
- o 1 bay leaf
- o Pinch dried chilli flakes
- o 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 450g (1lb) Waxy potatoes
- o 1 large green pepper deseeded and chopped
- 400g(14oz) firm white fish cut into large chunks*
- 500g (1lb 2oz) uncooked mussels in their shells*
- 175g (6oz) prepared raw baby squid cut into bite sized*
- 2 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley to serve.

What you do:

- 1. Heat the oil in the casserole over a low to medium heat and add the pancetta and chorizo sausage. Cook for 2-3 minutes until the pancetta begins to brown and the chorizo has released its oil. Remove from the casserole with a slotted spoon and place into a small bowl for later use.
- 2. Add the onions and garlic to the oil in the casserole and cook for a few minutes until softened.
- 3. Add the tomatoes, wine, bay leaf, chilli flakes and salt. Bring to a simmer then reduce the heat to low and continue to cook with the lid off for 15 minutes.
- 4. Peel and dice the potatoes to 1 cm (1/2 inch) cubes and add to the tomato sauce along with the chopped peppers, cooked pancetta and chorizo. Stir well, place the lid on the pan and continue to cook for 15 minutes. After this time the potato should be tender but not soft.
- 5. Stir the chunks of fish, mussels in their shells and lastly the squid into the slow simmering sauce and replace the lid. Continue cooking for 15 minutes. Do not lift the lid during this time. Allow to stand with the lid on for 5 minutes after turning off the heat.
- 6. Gently stir the contents of the casserole being careful not to break up the fish and discard any unopened mussels.
- 7. Sprinkle over the chopped parsley and serve traditionally straight from the casserole with some crusty bread.

Willows Uniform Exchange:


