Thirty pupils from Willows attended with Miss Cook and Miss Nelms and listened to talks, debates and information on what is to come over the next few months. schools from across Cardiff. They were fantastic and were also able to share their experiences about their winning trip to Dubai.

Willows Uniform Exchange:




Remember the amount of reading that you complete will not only lead to you being awarded your reading badges but to a successful future.




