Cardiff University / Open University Visit for Y9:

On Tuesday, pupils from Year 9 were very fortunate to attend a science session with Dr Martin Suttle, a Planetary Scientist. He works with the Open University and is embarking on his Wales-wide tour with his lecture entitled "How to build a planet" tonight, starting with Techniquest in Cardiff Bay. Pupils were told about meteorites, asteroids and comets and they were able to touch samples of rock from the moon and a Martian Meteorite. They then worked with scientists from Cardiff University on comets and how they are using technology and science to work out the size, shape and composition of the ice giants. The whole team from both the OU and Cardiff were hugely complimentary of the Year 9 pupils and the questions they asked. They commented on their behaviour and politeness and are really looking forward to coming back to show us the new infra-red camera kits they are purchasing (that we can borrow) and to work with us on NASA's Planetary Defenders Project. Please congratulate the pupils on being excellent ambassadors for the school.


