




Weekly Newsletter - 17.06.22

Sports Day Arrangements:



The Olympic motto "Citius, Altius, Fortius" is Latin for "Faster, Higher, Stronger" which only means one thing, we are fast approaching The Willows Sports Day 2022!

PE Kit:

As you will remember, during the pandemic, Covid rules were applied which meant that pupils could not change for PE lessons. These rules have since been lifted, however, we have allowed pupils to continue to come to school in their PE kit on days that they have PE or BTEC Sport. We would like to continue this rule next academic year, however, we will need your full support on this as there has been an increase in pupils deviating from the rules outlined below:

• All pupils to wear the blue and black **Willows branded PE Top** either the round neck or V neck version is permitted. Pupils are allowed to wear a black base layer underneath if they wish to cover their arms.

- Only black Bottoms are allowed shorts, sports leggings or tracksuit bottoms (see photographs).
 Shorts must be of an acceptable length, just above the knee is acceptable.
- Trainers preferable black.
- Any brand logos must be hidden, small or discrete e.g. under 3cms in size such a small Nike tick.
- During cold weather a plain black hoody which follows the branding guidelines above is allowed.
- The PE department will inform pupils if / when specialist equipment is needed e.g. football boots.







Petr Torak Visit:

Petr Torak MBE, Honorary Consul to the Czech Republic and CEO of Compas charity made a surprise visit to 9 Attfield this Wednesday. He discussed our recent visit to Prague and talked about how he worked hard to become the first Roma policeman in the UK. Petr also discussed roles to undertake in the police force, especially if pupils are multilingual, including preventing slave trafficking, immigration and working with police dogs. We were all very inspired and hope to continue to encourage our pupils in their dreams and aspirations



Rights Respecting Schools - World Refugee Day



World Refugee Day is an international day designated by the United Nations to honour refugees around the globe. It falls each year on June 20 and celebrates the strength and courage of people who have been forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution. World Refugee Day is an occasion to build empathy and understanding for their plight and to recognize their resilience in rebuilding their lives.

This year, the focus will be on the right to seek safety. Every person on this planet has a right to seek safety - whoever they are, wherever they come from and whenever they are forced to flee.

As a Rights Respecting School, we pay attention to Children's Rights and consider which articles relate to what we are learning about:



Article 22 (refugee children)

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.



Article 10 (family reunification)

Governments must respond quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents apply to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has a right to visit and keep in contact with both of them.

Reflection...

The theme of this year's World Refugee Day is the right to seek safety.

Spend a few minutes thinking about what makes you feel safe.

- How can we learn more about the lives of other people whose experiences may be very different to ours?
- How can all children, including refugees be helped to feel safe?
