





PE Kit:

Unfortunately, we are still experiencing problems with pupils turning up to school in PE kit on the wrong days and / or wearing PE kit that takes advantage of our rules. We will need your full support on this if we are to keep or non-changing system next academic year. The rules are outlined below:

- All pupils to wear the blue and black **Willows branded PE Top** either the round neck or V neck version is permitted. Pupils are allowed to wear a black base layer underneath if they wish to cover their arms.
- Only **black Bottoms** are allowed shorts, sports leggings or tracksuit bottoms (see photographs). Shorts must be of an acceptable length, just above the knee is acceptable.
- Trainers preferable black.

- Any brand logos must be hidden, small or discrete e.g. under 3cms in size such a small Nike tick.
- During cold weather a plain black hoody which follows the branding guidelines above is allowed.
- The PE department will inform pupils if / when specialist equipment is needed e.g. football boots.

Some amazing news from Debate Club this week, who ... only went and won the Wales Debate Mate Cup 2022, becoming debating champions!

Willows were up against tough competition from schools across Cardiff who were all battling for the prestigious Wales Debate Mate Cup 2022 at the Principality Stadium. Willows entered three teams, all of whom were successful in all three debates.

Our pupils debated on topics such as living in a cashless society, should sports people influence key social policies, music that promotes crime should be banned and technology disconnecting rather than connecting. Both Mrs Cook and Miss Nelms were so proud of our pupils, it really was an amazing experience seeing our pupils speak so articulately on such key issues. Following the three rounds one of our teams made the final debate against Eastern







High and won! A special mention to Rabec in Year 10 who also won an award for most improved speaker.

Pupils from 10SC excelled themselves this week in a day's Talk The Talk workshop. They demonstrated great teamwork and their wonderful vocabulary throughout the day. Languages Department:

We are now approaching the end of what has been a very busy exam season in the Languages Department. Pupils have sat GCSEs in French (our taught language) but also in Arabic, Spanish, Italian, Polish and Russian. Whilst we do not have formal lessons in these languages, we are able to enter pupils in Year 10 and 11 for a GCSE in languages in which they are already fluent. Pupils receive guidance on the exam requirements but must already be able to read, write, speak and listen to the language. Sadly not all languages are available at GCSE. Mrs Brace will usually meet with your child at the start of Year 10 to find out more about their language skills if you have informed us that their home language is one which is available as a GCSE.

You can help your child during Years 7-9 by ensuring that as well as continuing to speak and listen to the language that they also have opportunities to read and write it. If you would like to find out more or ask any questions then please contact Mrs Brace.


