Sports Day 2022:

Final Report and Scores:

Over the last few weeks we have hosted our school Sports' Competition. Here is a report on the track and field events.

Highlight of the Throws:

Rhianna Jones got Year 10 off to a winning start in the discus with a massive throw of 17.08 metres.

There was a very competitive Year 9 and Year 10 boys discus competition with Ethan Hooper-Adams (Year 9) narrowly beating Kayal Rowe (Year 10) to pick up valuable points for their teams.

There was an exciting lower school girls' discus competition with the lead constantly changing each round of throws and with her final throw Tianna Gordon snatched the win from Sienna Robinson. Both girls are in Year 7 and have a promising athletics career ahead.

The lower school boys' discus competition was won convincingly by Year 8, Rahman.

In the shot there were strong wins for lower school athletes, Gertrude Tsohuka (Year 7) and Ahmad El Haj Moussa (Year 8).

Enya Donovan-Males showed of her power and athleticism to take the upper school girls' competition. The Year 9 and 10 boys' shot putt was a close encounter with Bassam Saleh (Year 10) winning on count back from Callum James-Scott who will be someone to look out for next year.

The Year 10 throwers took both upper school javelin competitions with victories for Cadisha Sumare and Tobi Bamidele.

The lower school girls' javelin was won by Zahra Albadr (Year 7) and Oshai Sutton (Year 7) beat his nearest competitor by over 3 metres.

After a morning of pushing, pulling and slinging implements the scores were.....

Lower School Competition:

Year 7: 122 points Versus Year 8: 122 points

Upper School Competition:

Year 9: 96 points Versus Year 10: 144 points

Highlight of the Jumps:

Going into the afternoon, the lower school competition could not have been closer and Year 9 needed some big wins in the jumps.

The lower school standing long jump champions for 2022 are Hollie-Mai McMullen and Nathan Mba-Aba both in Year 8 who showed great explosive power.

After a victorious discus, Rhianna Jones (Year 10) pulled off a second win of the day in the standing long jump and Oskars Vikis became the upper school boys' champion with a jump of 2.44 metres.

Standing Triple Jump proved quite a challenge for some athletes but Gracie Furnish used her poise and rhythm to win the lower school girls' competition with a jump of 6.64 metres. The lower school boys' competition saw twins Souhibe and Omar (year 7) battle it out with Omar coming out on top.



In the upper school, boys' standing triple jump Suhas Majjara (Year 9) showed excellent co-ordination required to link the three phases to become 2022 champion by beating the year 10 athletes. For her third win of the day Rhianna Jones hopped, skipped and jumped to victory.

Using her height to great advantage Erin Rees (Year 7) won the lower school girls' high jump and Franz Salomero snatched victory on count back from Juraid Ali who are both in Year 8, we look forward to many more exciting battles in the coming years.

Chloe Walter (Year 10) showed her class to win the upper school girls' high jump. There was an exciting end to the day with Seif Jawad (Year 9) and Bassam Saleh (Year 10) battling it out to become 2022 High Jump Champion. Both boys pushed each other to greater heights with Seif finally winning on count back.

So, after a day of field events the running scores were ...

Lower School Competition:

Year 7: 262 points Versus Year 8: 216 points

Upper School Competition:

Year 9: 196 points Versus Year 10: 286 points

It was all to play for on Thursday 14th July when the sprinters and endurance athletes took to the track ... Who would be 2022 Champions?

Track Events:

The track events started with a bang, the 100m being the first race. Miracle Oladoyinbo (Year 8) powered down the track to take the first race. The year 9 sprinters dominated the upper school races with Ashley Cossa and Jamie-Leigh Mathias-Dale proving too quick for the rest of the field.

After a blistering start to the track session came the more controlled endurance event – The 800m. Lili Williams (Year 7) ran an even paced race to win the lower school competition and Paige Morgan Rose (Year 10) used her experience to win the upper school race. In the boys' middle distance Ahmed Obaed (year 8) proved too strong for the rest of the athletes. In the upper school boys' 800 metres Kaylum Lee (Year 10) kept his composure and ignored the intense pace set by the other athletes at the start of the race. Kaylum kept a smooth steady pace to take the win as he slowly went past the other runners one by one who were clearly suffering from starting too quickly.

Then it was back to the longer sprint, the 200 metres. In all four races the younger athletes proved too quick for their older competitors. Chloe Williams (Year 7) and Raifa Said (Year 9) won the girls races and Omar Elgbaily (Year 7) and Seif Jaward (Year 9) won the boys races.

Sports Day 2022 culminated with the relays which is crowd favo lower school girls race year 7's proved too sleek for the year 8 te and in the boys' race year 8 were victorious. The upper school boy race was very competitive with Year 10 taking the win over Year 9.

After two days off competition the final scores were:

Year 7 versus Year 8: 1st Year 7 386 Points 2nd Year 8 332 Points

Year 9 versus Year 10: 1st Year 10 346 Points 2nd Year 9 326 Points

Year 10 Careers Carousel:

Willows recently hosted a careers carousel for Year 10 pupils. Different industries were invited into school to talk to the pupils about their profession and the various skills they would need to be successful both in school and in employment. The employers in attendance were:

Literacy at Willows this Year:

This year has been particularly successful for our pupils. Not only did our Debate Club members win the prestigious Debate Mate National Cup, but two of our Y11 pupils even made it to the Dubai Expo (sharing their expertise with other young people from around the UK, various dignitaries and even Prince William)! Just last week, our Y7 Creative Writers were applauded for their wonderful work and deportment at their graduation ceremony at Cardiff Metropolitan University; moreover, a group of Y9 pupils were praised for their performance in a mock trial led by the Law firm Martyn Prowell Solicitors. So impressed were the firm that they have been invited to visit the company and potentially sit in on a real trial in the new school year!

It has been a super year for developing our 'Cultural Capital' too. A group of Y7, Y9 and Y10 reading enthusiasts were taken to the Hay Festival and were delighted to get their books signed by the visiting authors. In March, all of Y8 were treated to a fantastic performance of Shakespeare's Macbeth by Quantum Theatre. They were particularly dazzled by the stage craft and were delighted to be allowed to hold the props and be given a tutorial in stage fighting by the cast, who were equally delighted by the fantastic behaviour and attitude of our young people. Y9 had a similarly exciting experience watching Quantum's A Christmas Carol before Christmas – a super impressive 'three-hander'. All of our pupils conducted themselves with the utmost respect and decorum, showing our visitors what fine young people they are.



Perhaps most satisfying of all (because it has affected all our pupils) has been the great success of our Academic Vocabulary Bees on the back of our Tutor Time Reading Programme. During morning Tutor Time, all our pupils have read three whole books, exposing them to a potential 150 new Tier Two ('academic') words this year alone. They have been self-quizzing those words to help them 'stick', culminating in the termly Bee. The Bees have become highly competitive, with Y9's running considerably over time with an

additional 5 bonus round questions to break the scoring deadlock! Our motto is 'Words Give US Power' and we've certainly seen some powerful young people walking away with lots of Golden Tickets and Amazon Vouchers. You can help your child to be more powerful by quizzing them on their words over the summer holiday too. Also, look out for a whole new set of words in their self-quizzing books next term.

We look forward to an even more Willows-tastic 2022-2023!
