#### STEM – Year 7 Wind Turbines Project:

Vince, Hannah and Stephen from the 'Engineering Education Scheme Wales' along with Dave from AECOM and Jess from Kier construction came to school to work with all of our Year 7 students on a renewable energy project. Pupils were split into teams consisting of an Electrical Engineer, Mechanical Engineer and Project

Manager. Their task was to build mini wind turbines strong enough to provide the required volts to charge a mobile phone.

Our engineers of the future were able to interpret the partial instructions given to them to construct fully functioning wind turbines. All students thoroughly enjoyed themselves whilst learning the impact of climate change, the effect of global population increases and acknowledging that they are the future who will be required to deal with the effects caused by generations before them.



#### Bar Mock Trial:

Abigail Jones from 'Martyn Prowell Solicitors' came to talk to our debate club; plus, some extra year nines who have an interest in law. Our pupils were extremely enthusiastic and asked some fantastic and thought-provoking questions. They were then split into teams, and each given a role for our 'mock trial' event which takes place on Friday 15th July. Each pupil must prepare statements and questions for witnesses. The learning lounge will be set up like a real court room ready for the event!



#### **Cyrraedd Class News:**

Talal, Pashew and Ali (from our KS4 provision) visited Cambrian Wildwoods in Mid-Wales for a residential trip last week. This was organised by TGP, the refugee charity. The boys had a great time learning about outdoor survival. Several other refugees and asylum seeking pupils from other schools in Cardiff visited too and it is hoped that a strong network of new friends will be formed for the future.

#### The Young Entrepreneurs Club:

The Young Entrepreneurs are back! This time, throwing a party for the Year 7 cohort. To celebrate their first year in Willows High, there will be a party on Wednesday 13th July from 3.30pm afterschool in the theatre. There will be free carnival games, sweets and chocolates to buy and an assortment of trinkets such as stickers and badges made by the YE club. We can't wait to see the Years 7 there!

#### Poetry Diversity Workshop:

Year 9 pupils participated in a Culture and Diversity poetry workshop with Connor (the Welsh Poet Laureate for young people) and Duke, a spoken word performer. We all thoroughly enjoyed writing poems and discussing current issues that affect young people. A lot of us have now been inspired to write our own poetry. #### Mr Sage is 'facing the Dragon' at Ironman Wales!

Ironman Wales is less than 10 weeks away and Mr Sage will be 'facing the Dragon' in this world-famous triathlon. An Ironman triathlon consists of a 2.4 mile open water swim, a 112 mile bike ride and finishes with a 26.2 mile (marathon) run. All of this has to be done on the same day!

#### PE Kit:

A reminder that we will need your full support on this if we are to keep or non-changing system next academic year. The rules are outlined below:

- All pupils to wear the blue and black **Willows branded PE Top** either the round neck or V neck version is permitted. Pupils are allowed to wear a black base layer underneath if they wish to cover their arms.
- Only **black Bottoms** are allowed shorts, sports leggings or tracksuit bottoms (see photographs). Shorts must be of an acceptable length, just above the knee is acceptable.
- Trainers preferable black.
- Any brand logos must be hidden, small or discrete e.g. under 3cms in size such a small Nike tick.
- During cold weather a plain black hoody which follows the branding guidelines above is allowed.
- The PE department will inform pupils if / when specialist equipment is needed e.g. football boots.


#### **PE Top Appeal:**





## **Power to Young People:** Cardiff Influencers Programme 2022

This summer, the School Organisation Team in Cardiff Council is launching the **'Power to Young People: Cardiff Influencers Programme'**. This is a unique opportunity designed to enable Young People aged 13-14 to become directly involved in shaping strategy and influence how the Council will invest millions of pounds in education across the capital of Wales over the next 10 years.

#### What would I need to do to become a Cardiff Influencer?

There are four phases within the Cardiff Strategic Influencers Programme designed for participants to influence and contribute toward meaningful change. The first is a week's summer school based at County Hall, the seat of power for Cardiff's Council. 


